Burglary

- 3 Burglaries have occurred in the Ingol / Tanterton area.
- 1 Burglary was a shed break, but nothing was taken, owner believe offenders were after their bikes as a bike lock had been left on top their bins that does not belong to them.
- 2 Burglaries occurred at neighbouring addresses on Cottam Hall Lane. A pushbike was taken from one address that was recovered hours later. The other address had two motocross bikes stolen from a locked and secure garage whereby offenders had forced entry.

Robbery

1 Robbery outside Nisa Store where a male was threatened with a knife

Assaults

There were 16 assaults since the start of the year.

- 2 occurred at care homes. These patients were referred to a mental health team. The care home has a duty to report and we have a duty to crime it but prosecutions are not in the public interest.
- 4 of these were domestic incidents.
- 6 were repeat incidents at an address on Sylvancroft, whereby a young child has caused problems for their family. Police and partner agencies are helping to address this problem.
- 1 of Dog Bite
- 2 assaults appeared unprovoked

Criminal Damage excluding vehicles

There were 6 incidents of criminal damage (excluding vehicles) in this time period.

- 2 addresses have had a window in their address smashed.
- A young child damaged a wardrobe, this is at the same address where their was multiple assaults on Sylvancroft.
- A large group of youths reported to have ripped of CCTV from the wall of Tanterton Community Centre.
- Lock damaged on Cottam Hall Lane the same day when the burglaries on this street occurred.
- Malicious damage by a tenant

Anti-Social Behaviour

There have been 46 incidents of anti-social behaviour this year. Many of these calls have been for Covid breaches and this was expected as we have been in Lockdown for this time period. This has included several addresses breaching the Covid regulations, groups of youths gathering, and football matches being played.

Other ASB has included:

- Kicking at doors
- Youths throwing stones at vehicles
- Noise nuisance
- In regards to moped/motorbike nuisance, an email address has been set up which allows residents to send in photos of the bikes causing a nuisance. This will make it easier for us to identify the bikes and go down the route of either giving them a warning or seizing the bike. Opdismount@lancashire.pnn.police.uk.
