Ingol & Tanterton PACT Meeting – Wednesday 4th December 2019

The minutes of the previous meeting were accepted.

The priorities from the last meeting were discussed. These were:

1. Motorbike use on Ingol Golf Course.
2. Parking around Sainsbury's, Tanterton Hall Road

1. Since the last meeting there had been 8 calls about motorbike nuisance since the last meeting. 4 bikes were seized in the last month and this had a reduction on the number of calls with the last call being on the 5th November. But we predict it will calm down over the winter compared to the number of calls we received in the summer.

2. We have continued to monitor this. Cllr John Potter said that double yellow lines have been discussed and approved by the Council and they were waiting for the next stage of the process. The residents said that there is a particular issue between 7am and 9am and so we will continue to monitor. 7591 – I will also report that the bus stop road markings have not been put back on the road after resurfacing.

Since the last PACT meeting there were 382 incidents reported, of these, 95 were crimes.

Issues were raised about the zebra crossing on Tag Lane. Residents said they has witnessed motorists not observing the crossing and there have been near misses involving children and elderly residents.

Action: 7591 and the neighbourhood team are doing inputs about road safety in school assemblies in the area. We will also be in the area at peak times (such as school pick up and drop off) and will sanction any motorists who fail to observe the crossing.

Residents were asking about LANPAC funding for cameras at Tanterton Village Centre CCTV cameras.

Action: It was explained that LANPAC will match the funding from Tanterton Village Centre. So they will have to raise half of the funds. A figure of £1600 was put forward, with TVC funding £800. 3091 will update LANPAC.

Residents were reluctant to pay the 15p to ring 101

Action: 7591 has sent out a step-by-step guide showing how to report crimes on the website online. Residents are also reminded that Lancashire Police nor any other Police force receive any money from 101. Rather the 15p goes straight to the call handler. Unfortunately there is nothing that we can do about this as this is the case nationally.

Threefields identified as a 'hotspot' for Motorbike ASB

Action: logs for the area will be monitored to identify whether there is a pattern to days/ times that this is happening. It will also be added to the SA71 tasking in the ASB car.
